The average is that 83% of people came to church because a friend invited them to come.



The combination of your faith journey, faith-sharing, and worship together is one of the very best reasons to offer that invitation to anyone that may be looking for a community of faith that is caring, compassionate and open to all. Let it be so!!!

LOOKING BACK AND REMEMBERING SEPTEMBER 11, 2001

TWENTY TWO YEARS LATER

It's been 22 years. No matter how many years have passed, nobody can actually comprehend what happened that very day. An overwhelming share of Americans who are old enough to recall the day remember where they were and what they were doing when they heard the news. Yet, an ever-growing number of Americans have no personal memory of that day, either because they were too young or not yet born.


The events of September 11, 2001, changed the lives of victims' families and friends, survivors, first responders, rescue and recovery workers, volunteers, and millions of Americans and people around the world. In the days, weeks, and months that followed 9/11, most Americans said they were praying more often. Americans also turned to religion and faith in large numbers. For a time, the September 11th attacks stirred a sense of national pride and unity for many. It took a tragedy to unite us. It should not take another tragedy to unite us again.

For most Americans, "Never Forget" means "Always Remember." We remember in part because we see the ripples of that tragic day continue to impact our world twenty-two years later, and we wonder if there will ever be an end to violence, to war, and to hatred. We remember and we grieve our world's inability to learn the things that lead to peace.

We will forget because we're human and live in time. The best choice we have is to remember as well as we can for as long as we can, so that when we do forget, we leave wisdom, or at least understanding behind.

The hymn "Make Me a Channel of Your Peace," by Sebastian Temple (1928-1997) is a beautiful musical setting of the well-known Prayer of Saint Francis and has become one of Temple's most beloved compositions. This prayer for peace written in 1967, gained its popularity with people of all faiths over the years, because of its broadly inclusive language. "Make Me a Channel of Your Peace" was sung numerous times at memorials following the September 11th. tragedy. The familiarity of the text and the folk-like feel of the melody make it a great and long-lasting contribution to the hymnody of the church.

On this, the twenty second anniversary of the 9-11 terrorist attacks, let's not just pause for a moment at 8:46 a.m., but let's embrace the American Spirit. The same spirit that drew us together as a nation following 9-11 and come together to reclaim that spirit as brothers and sisters, friends, and neighbors; lifting up one another, helping each other out, and treating everyone as equals.


